A.

Superstition is a **belief** (信仰) that some objects or actions will bring good luck or some will bring bad luck. Many superstitions come from our **ancestors**(祖先)and ideas of magic; some people still believe in them today.

In Chinese culture, the color red is a lucky color. Many people believe that if you wear red and **gamble**(賭博), it will bring you luck. On the other hand, some people think touching on the **gambler's**(賭客)back or reading books behind a gambler will bring bad luck to the gambler. Because the word “back” and “book” have the same sounds like “bad luck” and “lose” in Chinese.

Another example, most Taiwanese believe “four” is an unlucky number, because the words “four” and “die” have a similar sound in Chinese. So, it is hard to find a hospital with a fourth floor in Taiwan.

There are so many superstitions in the world. Every country and culture has different superstitions. It is up to us to decide what is lucky or unlucky.

B.

People in the U.S.A, Great Britain (英國), and parts of Europe (歐洲) celebrate Halloween on October 31 every year. Like the Ghost Festival in Taiwan, this western (西方的) holiday has a long history, and parts of it were not so fun.

About two thousand years ago, there were only ten months in a year, and people in Ireland (愛爾蘭) believed that the ghosts of the dead would return to earth on the last day of the year. These ancient (古老的) people wore animal costumes or masks and lit bonfires (營火) to scare away the evil spirits. When they had to go somewhere, they carried lanterns made from turnips (蕪菁) with scary faces. Poor people asked for food from door to door on that evening, and they would get some bread or cake. Irish farmers would ask for money and food for a feast to honor (榮耀) Saint Columba. In the 1820's, when the Irish and Scottish people

immigrated (移民) to the U.S., they brought their traditions (傳統) with them. They replaced turnips with big orange pumpkins (南瓜). The pumpkin lanterns, with candles inside and carved-in scary faces, became jack-o'-lanterns. Today, kids wear scary costumes, carrying plastic jack-o'-lanterns, and go Trick-or-Treating—asking for candy because it is fun to do so. After several cases of children getting hurt and fatal (致命) shootings in Washington D.C. in 2002, adults would go with the kids to protect them from bad people.
